The little fishing harbour of <u>Trikeri Island</u> to indulge in fresh seafood.



The quaint little harbour village of <u>Kottes</u> (gulf of Volos) to taste the fresh local tuna.



The bay of <u>Tzasteni (gulf of Volos)</u> for a picturesque swim and/or onboard lunch stop.



The little green island of <u>Tsougria</u> for a refreshing swim.



The lush, heavenly beaches at <u>Kastani</u> to admire the natural beauty of Skopelos.



<u>Aï Giannis</u>, if you wish to see the pretty chapel from the first Mamma Mia movie. Access by yacht depends on wind conditions.



The museum at <u>Patitiri</u> (main port of Alonissos) for a little local history and folklore - including Pirates and WWII.



The <u>Old Town of Alonissos</u> for the local delicacies, walks through charming cobblestone streets and to admire splendid views and sunsets.



The uninhabited island of <u>Kyra Panagia</u> (Planitis) for complete escapism.

Our Top Sailing Tips for the Region

During high season especially, it is best to get to the main ports/harbours by 16-17:00 if you want to find a good mooring space.



Make sure that you have enough fuel, water and food provisions when planning to go to uninhabited islands like Peristera and Kyra Panagia.



The winds in the Sporades are mainly northerly usually up to force 5. We suggest courses that follow the southern coastlines of the islands, as they are well protected from the northerly winds, and have safe places to anchor/moor. The northern coastlines have stronger winds, higher waves and steep rocks.

To ensure safe anchoring, it's best to use the entire length of the anchor chain (60m), and secure the yacht with a line from a stable point on the shore.

During sailing, you should have the inflatable dinghy and the outboard engine secured aboard the yacht, in order to avoid any risk of losing them.



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
